- 4. Expect to speak in tongues – Acts 2:4, I Corinthians 12:2, 4-5, 14-15, 18**
- 5. Will not receive anything false – Luke 11:11-13**
- 6. Speak in other tongues – James 5:7, Hosea 6:3, Zech. 10:1**
- 7. No crowd should be around the candidate.**

What's the Deal with Communion? * (1 Corinthians 11:17-34)

Every 1ST Sunday & 3rd Wednesday, we usually spare a few minutes to partake of this supper and some don't even know why. Why do we take itty-bitty pieces of cracker and drink little bitty cups of grape juice on Sundays and Wednesdays? What's the deal with Communion?

There are four reasons revealed in 1 Corinthians 11:17-34. Before we look at the reasons, we need to understand why Paul took the time to explain them. Verses 17-22 reveal that the Corinthians were having a problem with their Communion services. Some were getting drunk on the wine. Some were gorging themselves on the bread and the other "fixins". Some were not able to partake at all because the others were being gluttons.

Verses 33-34 reveal that Paul wanted to make sure they would truly understand its meaning and to wait for each other as they partook. The bottom line to the problem: they didn't understand the deal with Communion. Paul took time to reveal four major reasons behind Communion. He explained that it was more than a meal, it was a memorial. When we partake of the Communion together...

1. **REMEMBER** (vs 23-25) what Jesus went through for you.
2. **REJOICE** (vs 26) that He died for you and will return because He didn't stay dead.
3. **REPENT** (v 27-29) of any sin you may have willingly committed this past week.
4. **RECONCILE** (v29) yourself back to God and to any brother or sister with whom you're broken a relationship.

Please note that you do not HAVE to take this every Sunday. Jesus said we should remember Him "whenever" we take it. If you are out of fellowship with God and do not feel comfortable in taking due to the warning of Scripture, that's okay. Use that time to repent and be reconciled and partake again next time. If you decided not to partake, may no man judge you. This is a time for judging ourselves. Paul said if we judge ourselves, we shall not fall under God's judgment of this sin of taking in an unworthy manner.

Why We Believe In the Rapture of the Church (Read/Study Online: victoryccc.org/disciple)

The “Rapture” is when Jesus calls the Saints to meet Him in Heaven. In an instant, the dead in Christ will rise and all Believers will go to be with the Lord.

“I Thes. 4:15-17) “For this we say to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive and remain until the coming of the Lord will be no means precede those who are asleep. For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive and remain shall be CAUGHT UP together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And thus we shall always be with the Lord”.

“Caught up” comes from the Greek word, “harpazo.” In the translation process, the Greek word was translated into the Latin word, “rapturo” from which we get the word, “rapture”.

I. TYPES OF THE RAPTURE IN THE OLD TESTAMENT

1. Enoch-caught up to Heaven without dying (Gen. 5:24)
2. Elijah-went up in the whirlwind without dying (II Kings 2:11)
3. Noah-rescued from the great flood judgment that destroyed everyone else on the earth (Genesis 7)
4. Lot and his family are rescued from judgment on Sodom and Gomorrah (Genesis 19)

II. WHO WILL GO UP IN THE RAPTURE?

1. Christ comes for His own (John 14:3; I Thes. 4:15-17)
2. Those who have died in the Lord
3. Those who are saved

III. WHEN WILL THE RAPTURE TAKE PLACE?

1. At any second (I Thes. 5:1-4)
2. Before the seven years of Tribulation (I Thes. 1:10)
3. The Church is not mentioned after the 4th Chapter of Revelation which immediately precedes the beginning of the Seven Years of Tribulation. The Church is again mentioned in Revelation 19 when Jesus returns with His Saints.

IV. HOW IS THE RAPTURE DIFFERENT THAN THE “SECOND COMING?”

1. The Rapture happens before the Great Tribulation
2. Jesus calls the Saints to meet Him in the air
3. The Second Coming happens at the end of the Great Tribulation
4. The Saints return with Him to rule and reign on the earth for 1000 years

There are 76 prophecies of the Rapture in the New Testament

Note: There are other opinions

concerning the Rapture and Second Coming but this is the general belief within Charismatic circles of the proper translation and interpretation of Scripture.

Why We Believe In the Second Coming of Christ

(Read/Study Online: victoryccc.org/disciple)

The first time Christ came to earth as a babe and lived until He was crucified and His Body was put in the tomb. On the third day He rose again and later ascended into Heaven. The second time Christ comes to the earth, He will come as a Mighty Warrior and King, defeat all of His enemies and establish His Kingdom on Earth.

“This same Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will so come in like manner as you saw Him go into heaven.” (Acts 1:11)

I. SIGNS PRECEDING THE SECOND COMING OF JESUS CHRIST

- A. *Israel will become a nation again which happened on May 14, 1948 (Matt. 24:32-35). The “fig tree” always represents Israel.*
- B. *False prophets (Luke 21:8)*
- C. *Wars and rumors of wars, nation rising against nation (Luke 21:9)*
- D. *The coming back together of Rome (Europe – European Economic Community) (Daniel 2:1-45 – The Golden Image represents the major Kingdoms of the Age. The feet of iron and clay represent the final form of Gentile world dominion – a revived Roman or Western power led by the Antichrist)*
- E. *Increase in natural disasters (Luke 21:11)*
- F. *Technology for the Mark of the Beast “666” (Rev. 13:16-17)*
- G. *Actual Mark of the Beast will have been required for anyone desiring to buy or sell (on forehead or hand). Eventual great persecution of those who do not take it toward the end of the Tribulation period*
- H. *People who accept Christ and refuse to deny the faith will be beheaded (Rev. 6:9)*
- I. *Rise of the False Prophet (leader of world-wide religion (Rev. 13:11)*
- J. *Great immorality, violence and rebellion (Matt. 24:37)*
- K. *Gospel of the Kingdom preached all over the world (Matt. 24:14)*
- L. *Horrific judgments will have taken place*
- M. *Abomination of Desolation will have been set up in Jerusalem (Dan. 9:11)*
- N. *Iraq (Babylon) will have been destroyed in an hour (Rev. 18:17)*
- O. *Two Witnesses (Men of God) will have been martyred in Jerusalem. The whole world will have watched them be resurrected on the third day and arise to Heaven (Rev. 11:11-14)*
- P. *Armies surround Israel to invade it (Ezekiel 38, Rev. 16:14-16)*

Why We Believe In the Person of the Holy Spirit

“And there are three that bear witness in heaven: The Father, The Word and the Holy Spirit; and these three are one.” (I John 5:7)

- I. The Holy Spirit is NOT an “IT.” The Holy Spirit is a person just like the Father and the Son. He has all of the attributes of a person.
 - A. *He can speak, see and hear.* (Matt. 10:19,20; Acts 13:2 I Tim 4:1; Rev. 2:7)
 - B. *The Holy Spirit is understanding, intelligent and wise*
 1. (I Cor. 2:10-11) “But God hath revealed them unto us by HIS SPIRIT; for the Spirit searcheth all things, yea, the deep things of God. For what man knoweth the things of man, save the spirit of man which is in him; Even so the things of God knoweth no man, the the Spirit of God.
 - a. The Holy Spirit teaches (John 14:26)
 - b. The Holy Spirit makes intercession (Rom. 8:7)
 - c. He is our Guide (John 16:13)
 - d. He comforts (John 15:26)
 - e. He builds us up (Jude 20)
 - f. He convicts of sin (John 16:8)
 - i. “*Conviction*” brings sin to our attention and points us to Christ for forgiveness. God always gives us hope.
 - ii. Satan “*condemns*” giving people no hope and giving them a sense of despair.
 - g. He draws us to Christ John 6:44,45)
 - h. He can be resisted (Acts 7:51)
 - i. He can be lied to (Acts 5:3,4)
 - j. He can be grieved (Eph. 4:30)
 - k. He can be quenched (I Thessalonians. 5:19)
 - l. He is our justifier and sanctifier (I Cor. 6:11)
- II. The Holy Spirit is present all through the Bible
 - A. *Creation*

(Genesis 1:2) “The earth was without form and void; and darkness was on the face of the deep and the SPIRIT OF GOD was hovering over the face of the waters.”

 1. Empowered judges, kings, prophets and priests (Judges 6:34)
 2. Impregnates Mary with Jesus Christ (Luke 1:35)
 3. Present at Jesus’ water baptism (Matt. 3:16)
 4. Led Jesus into the wilderness to be tempted of the devil (Matt. 4:1)
 5. Empowered Jesus’ ministry (Luke 4:18,19)

6. Raised Jesus from the dead (Acts 2:24)
7. Christ commanded disciples to wait in Jerusalem to wait for the promise of the Father (Acts 1:4)

13. He wrote the Scriptures through inspired men (II Cor. 3:16)
14. In the last chapter of the Bible, He extends an invitation:

(Rev. 22:17) **“THE SPIRIT and the bride say, Come! And let him who hears say, Come! And let him who thirsts come. Whoever desires, let him take the water of life freely.”**

III. One Unforgivable Sin

- A. *(Mark 4:28-29) “Assuredly, I say to you, all sins will be forgiven the sons of men, and whatever blasphemies they may utter; but he who blasphemes against the Holy Spirit never has forgiveness, but is subject to eternal condemnation.”*

Note from NEW SPIRIT FILLED LIFE BIBLE: “The unpardonable sin is not so much an act as a state of sin, a settled attitude that regards good as evil and evil as good. The scribes had repeatedly witnessed the deeds and heard the teachings of Jesus, but their willful blindness to the truth had resulted in such spiritual insensibility that they could no longer recognize the truth and were immune to its convicting power.”

Once the Holy Spirit is rejected, He no longer can lead people to Christ; therefore, there is no salvation.
